



WHO WE ARE

With 25 schools in 14 states, the Brown Mackie College Family of Schools (www.brownmackie.edu) is dedicated to providing educational programs that prepare students for entry-level positions in a competitive, rapidly-changing workplace. Led by President Danny Finuf, each Brown Mackie College school is licensed by the state in which it is located and accredited by accrediting bodies recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.

The Brown Mackie College Family of Schools extends back to the late 1800s as a single school, Kansas Wesleyan School of Business, which began operation on September 12, 1891. In 1938, the school was incorporated as The Brown Mackie School of Business under the ownership of Mr. Perry E. Brown and Mr. A.B. Mackie, former instructors at Kansas Wesleyan University in Salina.

In 2003, the Brown Mackie Colleges were purchased by Education Management Corporation (EDMC), and the new system of schools was renamed Brown Mackie College in November 2004. EDMC, the parent company of Brown Mackie College, is among the largest providers of private post-secondary education in North America, based on student enrollment and revenue. Founded in 1962, EDMC is headquartered in Pittsburgh.
